
How to Measure a typical single entry exterior door



- 1. Note that a 36" slab needs 38" RO & 40" outer brickmold measrements.
- 2. Note that from the outside the inside jamb $+ 2 \frac{1}{2}$ = jamb dimensions.
- 3. On a brick house consider the brickmold dimensions when ordering.
- 4. Actual width of slab door may be as much as 1/4" less.
- 5. Heigth of slab door is measured minus the rubber seal at the bottom.
- 6. Include jamb size (i.e. 4 9/16, 5 1/4, or other size)
- 7. Typically brickmold hangs over jamb 1 1/8".
- 8. The rule for determining the hand or swing of the door is this If you can physically touch the hinges with one hand, then the hand that reaches out to the doorknob is the swing. If you cannot touch the hinges then you're standing on the wrong side of the door. (i.e.) the door pictured above is a right hand door.
